### **Anti-Racist Study Group**

We highly recommend *James* by Percival Everett, a fascinating and instructive novel about the conditions of enslaved people, offering us insights

into the ongoing dynamics of race in the United States. We are taking a break for most of August and will return on September 8th. Our book will be White Poverty: How Exposing Myths about Race and Class Can Reconstruct American Democracy by Rev. Dr. William J. Barber II. Rev. Barber identifies poverty as the moral issue of our time and, with others, has been building a "moral fusion movement," a multi-racial, multiethnic coalition of justice-loving people who will stand against the intertwining injustices, false narratives, and old myths undermining the possibility of democracy and worsening the problem of poverty in the United States. With this book Rev. Barber recruits "poverty abolitionists" to help achieve a Third Reconstruction, including living wages, quality healthcare, and educational opportunities for all. White Poverty educates and calls us to action, discrediting the myths that help perpetuate poverty and laying out a way forward. Rev. Barber's analyses and conclusions are passionate, persuasive, data-driven, empowering, and hopeful.
