THE SACRAMENT OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

When receiving Communion, please note that the bread on the tray in the separate cup is gluten free. Please leave that for those who cannot have gluten. There is water in the middle of the tray for those unable to have grape juice.

They will come: from East and West and North and South,
and sit at table in the kingdom of God.

Blessed be the kingdom, now and forever!

This is the Lord's Table:

**Trusting Him, we come to share the feast
He has prepared.**

It is written that "the Lord Jesus, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it, and said, 'This is my body which is broken for you. Do this in remembrance of me.' In the same way, also He took the cup, after supper, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.' For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until He comes."

**Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God of hosts,
heaven and earth are full of Thy glory,
glory be to Thee, O Lord most high.**

All glory be to You, O God, for Jesus Christ your Son, who was born of Mary, shared our weakness, was tempted in every way like us, suffered and died for us upon the cross, and was raised from the dead by your power, the victor over sin and death, Lord of creation and Head of the Church.

**Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest!**

**Grant, O Lord, by your Holy Spirit, that the bread
we break and the cup we share may be for us
a means of grace; that, receiving them, we may
be made one with Christ, and He with us,**

and remain faithful members of His body until we feast with Him anew in His kingdom.

With Christians through all ages and in every land,
we offer the prayer our Lord has taught us:

**Our Father who art in heaven,
hallowed be Thy name. Thy kingdom come,
Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us
our debts, as we also forgive our debtors.
And lead us not into temptation, but deliver
us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom, the
power and the glory forever. Amen.**
